Rabbi's Message

Touched by a friend's recent cancer diagnosis, I've decided to share with you



this month, the D'var Torah I shared at an evening discussing women's cancers and genetics. May all those affected by cancer find healing, strength, and support.

This evening, we're gathered to learn about an important issue for us all. Who among us has not been touched by cancer? We've each known the pain of loss, the heartbreak this disease carries. But in gathering to educate ourselves, we take the first important steps of a journey, and this week's double parasha, Nitzavim and Vayelech, provides, I believe, a road map.

You stand this day, all of you, before your Adonai your God – your tribal heads, your elders, and your officials, all the men of Israel. Your children, your women, even the stranger within your camp; from the woodchopper to the water drawer. (Deut. 29:0)

The first of our two portions tells us that the Israelites entered into the covenant with God as a community. No one, not even the strangers in their midst, were excluded from this sacred moment. With this description, I believe the Torah sets up the paradigm for Jewish existence; here, the Torah highlights the importance and power of community.

No one among us lives in a vacuum. If we are to face the challenge of cancer, we must do so in the context of community. Together, we draw strength from one another, and provide support for those in need. Together, we become a blessing for one another.

Further in our parsha we read:

I have put before you, life and earth, blessing and curse. Choose life- so that you and your offspring may live. (Deut. 30:15)

It might seem easy to give up hope, particularly when we learn of genetic predisposition to disease. But the Torah reminds us that life is a choice, not a state of being. When we choose life, we actively participate in our own existence, living out our lives to their fullest. By being here this evening, as a community, we make the statement that we choose life. By educating ourselves, by engaging with this topic, we contribute toward the cure we hope will one day be found. Knowledge is power.

The more we know, the more we can stand up to cancer, choosing life so that we and our descendants may live.

Finally, our second portion provides the following reassurance:

Be strong and resolute; be not afraid of them or dread them, for indeed, Adonai your God marches with you, God will not fail you or forsake you. (Duet. 31:6)

Just as community is an essential element in the fight to end cancer, so too is faith. No one can do it alone. And just as we rely on one another for strength, our parsha reminds us that God is with us. Generation after generation, God has been with us, from our journey out of Egypt and into peoplehood and through to modern times, God has remained steadfast.

BYBS Funeral Plan

BYBS has a funeral plan with Chicago Jewish Funerals, which is available for members and their immediate families at their option. To select this plan, simply call Chicago Jewish Funerals at 847-229-8822 and tell them that you are a B'nai Yehuda Beth Sholom member. They will handle all the details. The plan includes professional services of funeral director and staff, custodial and general care of remains, the option of a *tahara* (the traditional Jewish preparation of the body) a hearse/graveside transfer vehicle, staff and equipment for chapel and a graveside or synagogue service. Merchandise includes a simple, dignified semi-oval traditional casket of dark stained wood, muslin shroud (optional, not mandatory), register book, shiva and *yizkor candle*, *kriah* ribbons, service folders, use of prayer books, *kipot* and 50 standard acknowledgement cards. The funeral price is \$5,850. For further details, call the Temple office or Chicago Jewish Funerals. The plan is offered as a convenience for members and their families at a time of stress, but there is no obligation to use it. **If you wish to observe a Yahrzeit, please send the name and secular or Hebrew date to Cathy at the Temple Office.**

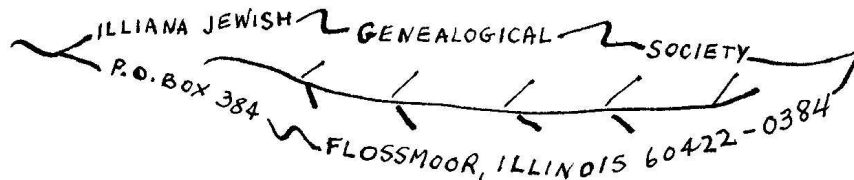

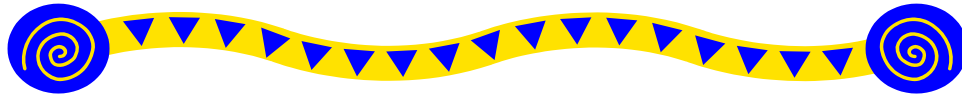
IJGS ANNUAL DELI DINNER

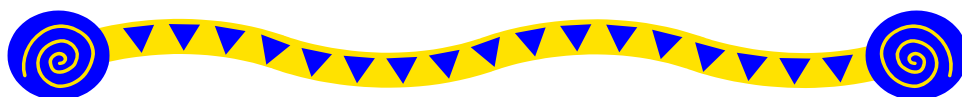
