Rabbi's Message

Over the past few years, I have adopted, at least in part, a custom that I learned from Rabbi Irv Wise of Congregation Adath Israel, in Cincinnati. When his congregants were marking a birthday or an anniversary, Rabbi Wise would invite them, at the end of a service, to share the number of years that they were celebrating. Then, off the top of his head, he would come up with a lesson in gimmatria, the system whereby each letter of the Hebrew alphabet has a numerical equivalent. So if, for example, a couple was celebrating their 26th wedding anniversary, then Rabbi Wise would make mention of God – the letters that make up God's name, yud, hey, vav, and hey, have a numerical value of 26- and the role that God plays in a marriage. Similarly, a person celebrating his or her 14th birthday, would most certainly be told that he or she was worth his or her weight in gold (zahav, gold in Hebrew, has a numerical value of 14).

What was so amazing, however, was that the gimmatria was done on the spot. Rabbi Wise would hear the number, and within a minute or so, he'd have a word or phrase to match it. It was a unique and amazing talent which I hadn't seen before, nor have I seen since.

Those of you who know me, know my math skills leave much (read very, very much) to be desired...So suffice it to say that on the spot, I could not do what Rabbi Wise used to do. What I can do, however, is gimmatria with a little preparation. And there is a birthday coming up: the 71st birthday of our homeland, Israel! In its honor, I went online to see what kind of words and phrases I would find. And the results, I think you will agree, did not disappoint.

The first word I found with a numerical value of seventy-one is the Hebrew word maleh (מלא). Meaning full, or whole, maleh seems an especially appropriate word to express that way that my heartand I hope all of yours- is feeling as we prepare to celebrate 71 years of Israeli independence. No question, these years have been plagued with war and terror, and challenge after challenge. But for nearly a century, Israel has shown remarkable bravery in the face of danger, and strength to handle anything that comes its way. Since 1948, Israel has established a democratic government – to date, the only one in that region- and has built-up a country famous for scientific achievement and technical innovation. Israel has been a world leader in so many fields including medicine, agriculture, and high-tech. And it continues to offer first-aid to so many other nations in need, following natural disasters and terror attacks. So, my heart is especially full, as we celebrate seventy-one years of success and invention, talent, and modernization.

The next word, whose numerical value is 71, is the word yonah (יונה). Meaning dove, this word seems especially symbolic. And, it makes me hopeful that this year, Israel's 71st year of Independence, might just be a year that is a little more peaceful. For centuries, the dove has symbolized shalom, peace, wholeness,

and completeness. Not a bad symbol for a country whose capital, yerushalyim, is supposed to be the city of wholeness and peace. And if the dove has a numerical value of seventy-one, then perhaps we might dub this the 'year of the yoah,' the year of the dove, and maybe, just maybe, in this year, our prayers for peace in Jerusalem, and wholeness, unity, and respect for all, will be heard and come true. Let us send those prayers and hopes up high as the dove soars.

Last, I found a word that hardly needs translation: Adonai (אדוני) Literally translated, the word Adonai means 'my Lords.' But, as it is most often used, the word is one of the many names with which we refer to God. And if the word yonah having a numerical value of 71 was a happy coincidence, then I feel like the fact that the word Adonai also does, must be fate. How appropriate that God should be present, even if only in the background, of this 71st celebration of independence. For God was present when our ancestors took their first steps toward freedom; it was God's outstretched arm that not only brought us out of Egypt, but into the Promised Land. And now, three-thousand years later, we can celebrate God as a part of the story of our people, in our land, the land of Zion and Jerusalem.

On the 5th of Iyar, corresponding to May 9, 2019, Israel will celebrate Yom HaAtzma'ut, or Independence Day. Our south-suburban community will celebrate locally a little later this summer. And though it has had and continues to have its challenges, the country and its people, our brothers and sisters, have shown remarkable spirit and resilience, overcoming difficulty to grow and to blossom, time and time again. May God watch over Israel, our homeland, filling it with doves brining peace, and filling our hearts with love, hope, and song.

Presidents' Message

It is May and we finally have warm weather. Winter was long, sometimes brutally cold and ended with a snow storm in the middle of April. As May begins, we immediately come to a very somber and meaningful day in Jewish history, Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day. This year it is observed on May 2nd and commemorates the approximately six million Jews who perished in the Holocaust.

In Israel, Holocaust Remembrance Day is a national memorial day. The first Holocaust Remembrance Day was observed in Israel in December, 1949. The day was marked by the burial in a Jewish cemetery of ashes and bones of Jews brought from the Flossenburg concentration camp.

Today in Israel Yom HaShoah services are held in schools and at a public ceremony in Jerusalem. Flags are lowered to half-staff and survivors light six candles to symbolize the six million Jews who perished in the Holocaust. Restaurants are closed for the day and television and radio programs are all Holocaust related. At 10 am air raid sirens are sounded as Israelis observe two minutes of silence. People stop their daily activities, motorists stop their cars in the middle of the road and exit, standing in silence.

It is important that we continue to remember, reflect and observe Holocaust Remembrance Day. Most of us trace our family roots back to Europe and as such are directly or indirectly affected by the Holocaust. Hyde Park Liberal Congregation, which was one of our legacy congregations, was originally founded by German Jews who lost family in the Holocaust. Today as that generation continues to pass, we must remember our history and ensure that history does not repeat.

May also brings Mother's Day, this year on May 12th. It is a day to thank our mothers for everything that they have given us, from birth, education, support for all of our endeavors and most importantly, unconditional love. So do something special for her. Serve her breakfast in bed, take her out to dinner or buy her flowers. Show her how much you appreciate her and how glad you are to have her in your life.




