### Rabbi's Message

While news
outlets broadcast
non-stop about
the upcoming
primary elections
in our country,
there is another
election taking
place that affects



us as progressive Jews. From now until March 11, online voting is open for the

World Zionist Congress elections. Today, I cast my vote. For just a \$7.50 investment, I registered and voted in the election, with the hopes for providing much needed funding and support to the progressive Jewish community in Israel.

The Israel Movement for Progressive Judaism was a fledgling community when I was growing up in Israel. In 1981, when my father was ordained at the Hebrew Union College, in Jerusalem, he was a part of what was only the second class of native Israelis to complete the Reform Movement's rabbinic program. To be sure, progressive Jewish life in Israel has grown by leaps and bounds since then. HUC has ordained more than 100 rabbis many of whom serve in some forty movement congregations throughout the country. And the Conservative movement, as well, has had a steadily growing presence in Jerusalem, where both the Conservative Yeshiva and the Schechter Institute of Jewish Studies host hundreds of students each year.

But our work is far from over; on the contrary, it's only just begun. Research suggests that close to fifteen percent of Israelis identify with

the Israeli Reform Movement. Still, the government does not recognize the legitimacy of non-Orthodox Judaism, and as a result, it treats Reform, Conservative, and Reconstructionist Jews in a much poorer manner, denying them the rights allotted to Orthodox Jews, whose expressions of Judaism are deemed "authentic" as opposed to ours. While I fully believe in the rights of ALL Jews to express their Judaism in any manner they wish, it is difficult for us progressive Jews to live Jewishly when we lack the support that our Orthodox counterparts receive from the State. More than once, the Reform Movement's Israel Religious Action Center, has gone to court, fighting for the rights of groups like women of the wall, to pray at the Kotel, the Western Wall, or for Reform rabbis like Rabbi Miri Gold, to have her salary paid by the government, just as her Orthodox neighbors do. Bit by bit, it is making a real difference.

In a recent CCAR newsletter, my colleagues Rabbis Beth and Jonathan Singer, shared the following about why it is so important for us to

vote in the WZC elections: "one reason our movement has gained traction is because of the pioneering efforts of our female and male colleagues who are defining what it means to be "Religious" in Israel. Another reason is because five years ago, we organized and won a majority of North American votes in the WZC elections. As a result, two important things happened: we were able to direct 4 million dollars a year for five years to the Israeli Reform movement. It also gave us representation and a voice to challenge religious extremism..." Both ARZA, the American Reform Zionist Association, and MERCAZ, the Zionist arm of the Conservative movement, have slates which seek to continue to promote progressive Jewish values, and to support the work of our movements in Israel.


to be proactive in our practice and procedures rather than reactive or paranoid. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Presidents or Board members.

## 38<sup>th</sup> World Zionist Congress Vote

The 38<sup>th</sup> World Zionist Congress is scheduled to meet in Jerusalem from October 20-23, 2020.

The elections will determine the size of the various delegations to the Congress and are scheduled to be held from **January 21 to March 11, 2020** (MLK Day to <u>Purim</u>).

Currently, the United States has 145 delegates in the WZC, the largest single delegation outside Israel. Thanks to a robust turnout in the 2015 elections, 56 of the 145 delegates (39 percent) represent the Reform Movement and, as a result, have been able to ensure that more than \$4 million a year (\$20 million over five years) is being directed to the Israeli Reform Movement. By comparison, the Israeli government annually provides nearly 4 billion NIS (\$1.1 billion) to Orthodox and Haredi institutions in Israel.

A strong election turnout among North America's Reform Jews and our supporters and allies will ensure that financial resources will continue to flow to our Israeli movement – including Reform congregations and institutions. It also will allow us to fill leadership positions in some of Israel's national institutions, including the World Zionist Organization (WZO), the Jewish Agency for Israel, and Keren Kayemeth LeIsrael – Jewish National Fund (KKL-JNF).



#### **VOTERS IN THE WZC ELECTIONS MUST:**

- Be 18 years of age or older (by June 30, 2020)
- Self-identify as Jewish
- Agree to the Jerusalem Program\*, the official platform of the WZO and the Zionist Movement
- Agree to pay a minimal processing fee.

\*The Jerusalem Program is the platform of the World Zionist Organization. It does not favor any specific organizational or political platform. It does not encourage Settlement activity across the Green line and simply tries to espouse the central principles of Zionism today.

We are asking all those who vote to simply acknowledge that this is the platform of the World Zionist Organization.
