Rabbi's Message

This month, I share with you a beautiful teaching by my colleague, Rabbi Jordie Gerson.

Recently, we celebrated Rosh Chodesh Iyar. Rabbi Jordie Gerson, teaches: "Iyar is actually an acrostic which spells out the initials of the verse – Ani Yud Yud (Adonai) Rofecha – which means, I am God Your Healer, and therefore, throughout history, it has been a time associated with healing, purification, and detoxification. According to Kabbalah Month by Month by Melinda Ribner, 'In Iyar, we are

supposed to let go of what doesn't support our well-being and what is toxic, what is false – it is a time for opening up to what does support our well-being.'

This is connected to the previous month of Nisan. Because Nisan, the month we are leaving... holds Passover – the holiday that marks the beginning of a new journey – from internal or external constraints – limitations – to greater (Continued on page 2)

freedom. Next month, Sivan – holds the holiday of Shavuot – when we receive the Torah, and total freedom. Which is all to say that our tradition imagines this period – the next month – as a transitional, liminal period in which we turn our attention to caring for ourselves so that we will be ready for freedom when it arrives. For our ancestors, this was freedom from slavery and Egypt. For us, it may be freedom from quarantine and isolation.

But how do we heal? Well, the first thing to know is that the Kabbalists imagined the journey to healing as one we don't undertake alone. God is our partner in healing, as in so many other things – because, in the words of the Talmud – those in prison cannot free themselves. So, as we heal, the Holy is there, by our side, strengthening our resolve and our journey towards wholeness. And also, the tradition believes that the healing we do in Iyar is a kind of inner spring cleaning, a letting go of all of those things that no longer serve us: vanity, materialism, status symbols, ego, overwork, and lack of attention to our bodies and health. Iyar is an opportunity to refocus on those things; to let go of what keeps us from health – physically, mentally, spiritually – and get back to the essentials of what we need to thrive, heal, and be whole and grounded. This may mean recommitting to an exercise routine, setting aside our comfort food, turning off the news, or meditation or yoga practice. It may mean choosing acts of resistance instead of anger, calling the people you love when you're feeling isolated, and creating a daily gratitude practice. Whatever it is, it's an opportunity to begin again, with what truly matters, as we move closer to freedom. So in this month of Iyar, this month of transition, my blessing for each of you is the gift of healing and hope, that these next few weeks of increased stillness provide you with the opportunity to focus on what really matters – your hearts, souls and bodies."

May Rabbi Gerson's words inspire you and make for a meaningful new month.

Presidents' Message

And so, in what should be a merry month of May full of celebrations and holidays, we continue to battle Covid-19, a pandemic that was not even in our consciousness several months ago. Here at Shir Tikvah, we have made changes to our religious observances, but we have not neglected you, our congregation. Following Governor Pritzker's orders, we are keeping the building closed for the month. When it is safe to open the building, we will have it deep-cleaned and will follow safe-distancing practices. Meanwhile, we continue to have services and weekly Onegs on Zoom. You should be receiving emails telling you how and when to check in to Zoom. Our virtual onegs are usually on Tuesdays at 7:00PM, and Friday night Candle Lighting and Kaddish is at 5:30PM. Saturday mornings, we are alternating Reform services one week at 10:15AM and Conservative services the following week at 9:45AM. We also have had several virtual minyanim. In addition, we have been sending out links to other services and adult education sites. Amy Bloomberg, the Federation representative in the South Suburbs, has been working with the members of CJC to reach everyone and to let

us know what helpful services are available to us. The committees and your Board are still functioning and meeting through conference calls and Zoom. Although Diedre has been working from home, she answers all voice mail and emails. Bob has been working to maintain the upkeep of our building. Rabbi has been making phone calls to the congregants to remain in touch with them. As you can see, we are definitely down, but we are not out.

At this point, we are planning to have a virtual annual meeting, but at some point, we will be opening the building for services and meetings. In addition to protecting everyone from the Covid-19 virus, we have another need for protection. As Business Insider reported on April 20, 2020, "The coronavirus pandemic is fueling anti-Semitism around the world, and the US is no exception." The Kantor Center at Tel Aviv University released a report in which Professor Dina Porat stated that the new rhetoric is not really new; it is just a restatement of old anti-Semitic conspiracy theories that blame Jews for economic problems and global disasters. We are seeing these hateful statements in social media, at rallies, and with "zoombombing." To protect you, the Board has approved a security policy which includes paid security at all events and services. Again, we are here for you, Shir Tikvah.
