## Shir Tikvah Waiver - Effective June 15, 2021

Thank you for being part of the Shir Tikvah community! We look forward to welcoming you back to our facilities.

## *Effective June 15, 2021: Consistent with public health recommendations, we require that everyone follow our rules regardless of vaccination status, prior infection, or recent negative test result.*

The rules apply to all events at Shir Tikvah facilities, both held inside the building or outside within our property.

If you are fully vaccinated, you are not required to wear a mask. Fully vaccinated means two weeks after your final vaccine shot.

If you have a condition or are taking medications that weaken your immune system, you may NOT be fully protected even if you are fully vaccinated. Please talk to your healthcare provider. You are encouraged to continuing wearing a mask if it is your personal preference.

If you are **not** vaccinated a face mask must be properly worn at Shir Tikvah facilities. This means covering the mouth and nose area with support straps around the ears or head. A mask will be provided if you do not have one.

Practice social distancing when in the building. Maintain at least three feet distance between people not living in the same household. Please use hand sanitizer stationed in the building as needed.

Only one person is allowed in a restroom at a time. Please do not congregate in the hallway by the bathrooms.

## Services, meetings and events should be hybrid with in-person, inside or outside and Zoom online.

A Board member will attend each service to ensure all the rules are being followed. Your health and safety are our main concern.

All members should register for the service or event with the Shir Tikvah office. You can register by contacting Diedre at the office or online with Signup.com. Signup.com will be used to track service attendance.

**Prior to attending any event, please self-screen yourself for the potential of COVID-19.** Ask yourself, if you are not feeling well in any way, if you have had a temperature at or above 100° in the last 14 days or if you had close contact with someone who is currently sick with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 in the last 10 days. If you answer yes to any of these questions, please stay home for your safety and the safety of your fellow congregants.

By attending in-person events at the synagogue, you acknowledge the following:

1. You agree to abide by the rules of the synagogue.

2. You understand and agree that even with these precautions, Shir Tikvah cannot guarantee your safety considering the pandemic. You must exercise your own sound judgment and good discretion to determine whether it is safe for you to attend in person, in the building.

3. Shir Tikvah is not liable, and assumes no responsibility, for COVID related sickness or injury incident to, or resulting from, the pandemic, the foregoing rules, or any violations of the foregoing guidelines.
