President's Message

Dear Fellow Congregant,

I hope you are doing well & keeping safe. This letter is to update the congregation on our status for High Holiday services.

We are planning on holding High Holiday services in person & on Zoom. This decision is based on the current conditions in our area. If conditions change & we need to adjust our plans, we will communicate all changes on a timely manner.

To ensure the safety of our members, we will require all members attending in person to properly wear a face mask when inside. This means covering the mouth & nose area with support straps around the ears or head. A mask will be provided if you do not have one. Please keep your mask on while you are indoors. Please feel free to step outside if you need to get some fresh air.

Although most of our members have been vaccinated, we still need to practice common sense rules to reduce the risk for everyone. If you want to socialize with other members, please meet outside before or after the services. After entry, individuals should proceed immediately to seats to avoid congregating or blocking the aisles. The aisles need to be open for safety & for members who need assistance getting seated. After the service, please exit the building & exchange greetings outside.

If you have a condition or are taking medications that weaken your immune system, you may NOT be fully protected even if you are fully vaccinated. Please talk to your healthcare provider. For your safety, attending the services on Zoom would be the safest option.

This year services will be held in two locations. Due to the limited capacity of the chapel, it was

decided to hold the Conservative High Holiday services at the Homewood Science Center at 18022 Dixie Highway, except for Erev Rosh HaShanah. The Conservative Erev Rosh HaShanah service will be held in the Shir Tikvah synagogue at 6:45PM followed by the Reform service at 8:00PM. All Reform High Holiday services will be held in the Shir Tikvah synagogue.

Rabbi Harari will lead the Reform services, while Jacob Cytryn has been retained to lead the Conservative services.

A High Holiday Ticket Request form has been mailed to all members. In addition, to providing your tickets, this will provide us with an estimate of the number of members attending in person or via Zoom. The form includes the waiver which list the rules for attending the service in person. This is like the waiver we have been using at our weekly in person services. We are requesting that you sign & date the form when you return your High Holiday Ticket Request form.

Security guards will be stationed at Shir Tikvah & the Homewood Science Center.

We look forward to a good holiday season & to seeing you in person or on Zoom.

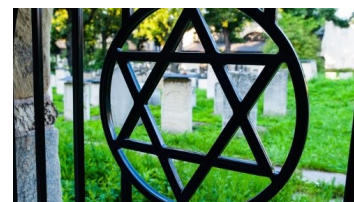

Between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, it is traditional to visit the graves of our loved ones, honoring the memories of those who came before us.

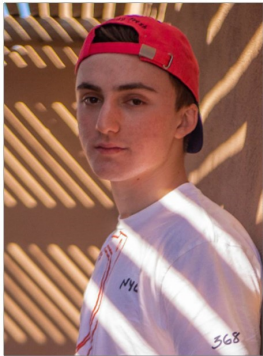

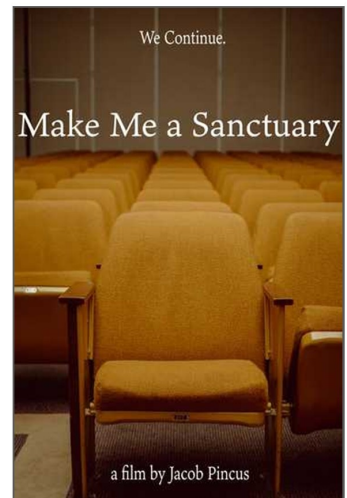

Jacob Pincus was born and grew up in Pittsburgh. Jacob recently graduated from high school and is taking his gap year in Israel. He will then attend University of Southern California and major in Film Production.

Three days after the Tree of Life synagogue shooting in Pittsburgh, thousands of people came together to protest the hate and violence in the country. Jacob Pincus had a connection to the city and the synagogue so he got in his car and drove down to document the event. **“Stronger than Steel” was shown at The Chicago Southland International Film Festival (CSIFF) in 2020 and nominated for Best High School Short & Best Documentary Short.**

In “Make Me a Sanctuary”, members in a synagogue in Beachwood, Ohio reflect on

their congregation’s history and how they have come to need a new house of prayer after nearly fifty years in a building built by Holocaust survivors.

Suzanne Patterson is a co-founder and judge for CSIFF at Governors State University. Suzanne also manages The Knowledge Exchange at Governors State University’s School of Extended Learning where she teaches a Cinema Studies course.
