Rabbi's Message

Friends,

As we enter into November, I know many of us are looking forward to another Thanksgiving-
Chanukah begins just one day after Thanksgiving weekend, on November 28th. But I've got Israel on the brain. Maybe it's the fact that I am missing my family whom this spring, I won't have seen for three years

because of the Pandemic. Maybe it's the fact that right now, Israel is entering into krembo season; the delicious cookie, topped with marshmallow fluff and a thin coating of chocolate is the official winter treat and I am craving one! Truthfully, I think it's that so much has happened since my last visit: A new government took over and for the first time in Israel's seventy year history, a Reform rabbi has been elected to the K'nesset. Liberal Jews are experiencing some new energy and interest and I'm excited to see where the country is headed.

At the end of October, I was privileged to take part in the program titled "Hinei Mah Tov" which featured a presentation by Rabbi Na'amah Kerman, Dean of the Hebrew Union College and her husband, Professor Elan Ezrachi, who runs a tremendous program at the University of Haifa for Israelis to learn about American Judaism and Jews. It is the first program of its kind, seeking to build bridges between Israeli and North American Jews whose lives are intertwined and who share a common interest in and love for the State of Israel. As Professor Ezrachi noted in his presentation, the Israel in which he grew up, the Israel of the 1950's and 1960's, was one where Americans played little role, where he had no

interaction with them because they were foreigners. This comment struck home with me as I recalled growing up in 1980's Israel where until age ten or so, I had no concept of what American Jewish life even looked like. And yet, when we learn from one another, when we build bridges and come to understand one another as we are, not, as Professor Ezrachi noted, as we think of the other, we have the extraordinary opportunity to build relationships and strengthen the state that is our common heritage and our homeland.

That is why I am so excited about the opportunities we have, upcoming, in November and December. On Sunday, November 7th at noon, Shir Tikvah will join with a group of congregations in the Chicago area to hear Rabbi Gilad Kariv, the first Israeli Reform Rabbi elected to the K'nesset. Rabbi Kariv, the former director of the Israel Religious Action Center and the former CEO of the Israel Movement for Progressive Judaism, will speak to us about his work in Israel's government and about his efforts on behalf of pluralistic Judaism. Rabbi Kariv will present over Zoom. I highly encourage you to take advantage of this extraordinary opportunity to hear directly from Rabbi Kariv. See the flyer in this bulletin or in the weekly e-mail and follow the link to register for this free session. We thank North Shore Congregation Israel for making this program possible and for including us in this exciting program.

President's Message

It feels like fall today, as temperatures drop, and the leaves are changing colors. I hope everyone had a good High Holiday experience this year whether in person or on Zoom. Services ran smoothly, both in the Shir Tikvah synagogue and the Homewood Science Center. Services continue to evolve, as we adapt to the current circumstances. Although, High Holidays have passed, there is still much going on at Shir Tikvah. Our committees are active, and we are always looking for members with creative ideas and input.

We started a Re-Opening committee, thinking this would be a short-term issue. We thought, once COVID was under control, we would open, and the committee could disband. We now realize, that dealing with COVID will be on going as circumstances change. The committee will continue to meet monthly to discuss the current policy and any potential changes. The committee recently changed the policy to allow food service in the building.

The food must be individually wrapped items or pre-packaged meals. This will allow the JCC Shalom Over 50's to have lunch in the building and an Oneg after services. Beverages can be served in individual containers or pre-filled cups. The kitchens can be used to prepare food for fundraising sales or to be individually wrapped for later use. The kitchens can be used for school learning activities. These changes should bring back a little normality to our routines.

A Technology committee was started last year before High Holidays, to prepare for observing the High Holidays on Zoom. This included learning how to broadcast on Zoom and having someone to monitor the online service such as muting viewers. The other objective was to ensure all our members could access Zoom and learn how to get online. I hope that everyone who wants to access

our activities on Zoom is now capable of logging on to Zoom. We have become good at broadcasting via Zoom. Therefore, the Technology committee has not met since the High Holidays last year.

During the current year, however, we have noticed a need for a Technology committee with a different objective. This was apparent at several events, as the microphone went dead at the Community Shabbat, finding a sound engineer for the Klezmer band or finding assistance to monitor Zoom during High Holidays. We all realize that broadcasting services and events on Zoom is here to stay. For High Holidays, thanks to Larry Burrows and Irwin Friedman, we were able to interface our sound system with Zoom to provide better sound quality for those on Zoom. These changes are happening at the last minute when we realize we have a problem.

We need a committee to determine the best way to manage our activities online and what is required in personnel and equipment to accomplish this. A committee can make sure we have the proper equipment for events or locate the proper service providers to manage what is above our ability. I am not sure if this is part of a Technology committee, but it might be worthwhile to review our content on social media to make sure our communications are getting to the correct audience. This would be a good topic for the committee to discuss. Any members with a good knowledge of technology or social media please let me know if you are interested in joining this committee.

I always mention the Caring Committee that we began last year, because it provides such an important service to the congregation. Committee members make social calls to other members and members on the Mi Shebeirach list. Diedre posts

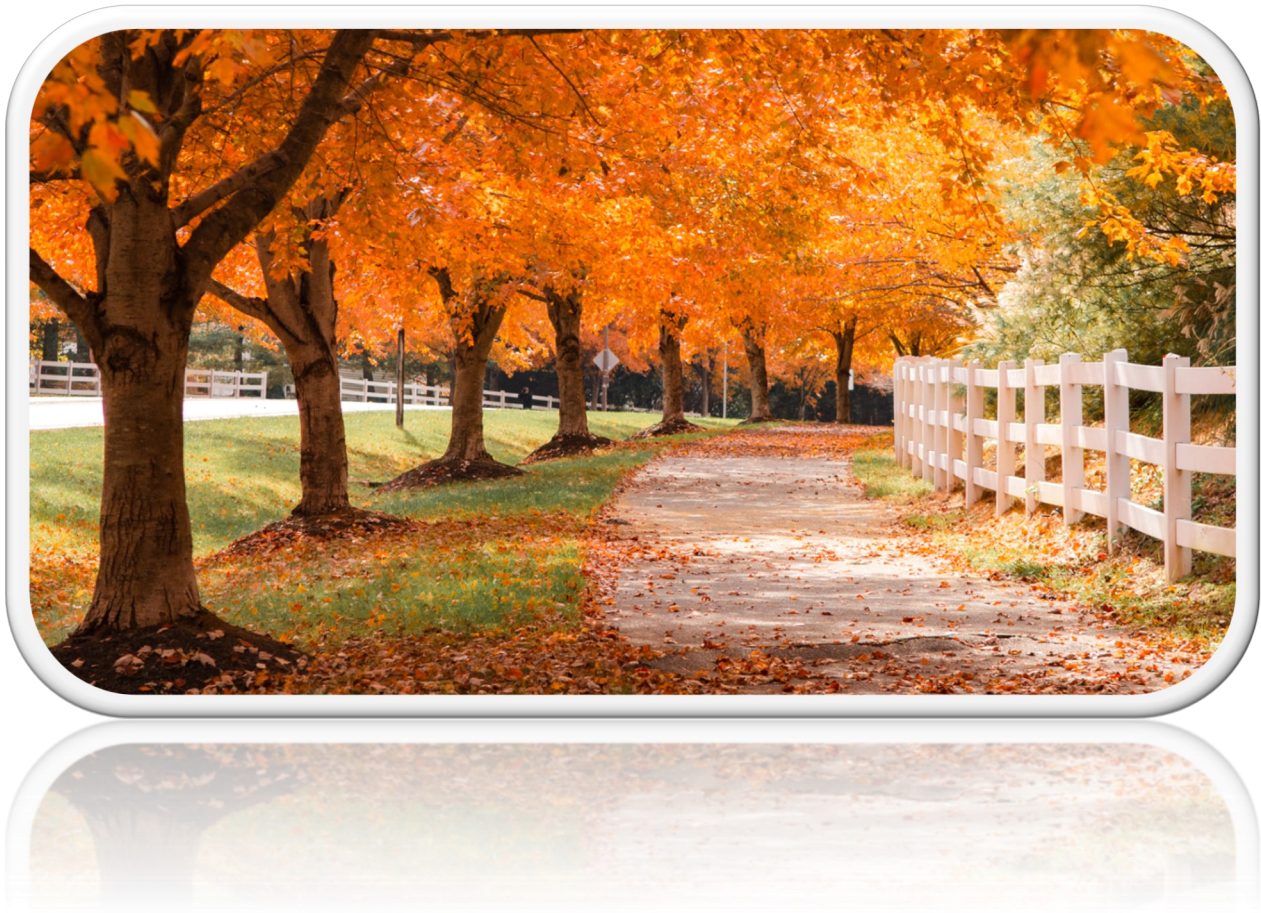
the calls in a system to allow Rabbi and me to be aware of our members' situations. This has proved to be a valuable tool and we have received positive feedback from members who have been contacted. It is not only well received by those being called but also is a mitzvah for those doing the calling. If you are interested in calling or receiving a call, please contact me, Rabbi Harari or Eila Kolton who chairs the committee.

If you enjoyed the educational programs this year or have ideas for different types of programs, please bring your ideas to the Adult Education committee. Last year, someone suggested a performance by a Klezmer band, and it turned out to be our most successful event. The Fundraising committee is a well-attended group that plans our annual events such as the Ad Book, Shalach Manot

and holiday food sales. We are always looking for innovative ideas to raise funds for the congregation.

Ritual issues, services and holidays are managed by the Ritual committee. The Facility committee manages our property, and the Finance committee oversees our investments and prepares the annual budget. There are all kinds of opportunities to volunteer to help and collaborate with other congregation members. Shir Tikvah has much to offer and working together we will keep Shir Tikvah serving our community.

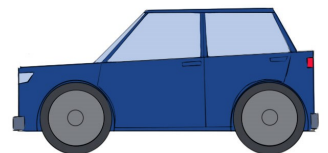
