Rabbi's Message

Shalom Friends,

I think we all held our collective breath as a hostage situation played out at Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville, Texas for nearly twelve hours. Miraculously, the situation ended with the release of all hostages, physically unharmed. It was the outcome for which we prayed and we are so grateful it could be achieved.

For me, personally, the situation was surreal. I was in rabbinical school with Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker for two years. I shared a Shabbat dinner or two with him and his wife. I attended his eldest daughter's baby naming, and I took part in some classes he taught. On that Shabbat, I struggled to wrap my head around the idea that I knew one of those hostages personally. I know that my colleagues did as well. Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker is, simply put, a mensch. He is kind, thoughtful, smart, and caring. He is everything the news has said about him, and maybe even more. It was his ability to stay calm under pressure and think and act quickly that ultimately helped the hostages escape. The Talmud teaches that whoever saves a life saves a world in its entirety. Rabbi Cytron-Walker saved the world three times over.

The attack on Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville, Texas was an attack on Jews and Judaism. In the face of rising Antisemitism, this attack reminds us of our own vulnerability, and of the need to stay alert. Still, we need not panic. Both the Jewish Federation (JUF) and the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) have stated that they do not believe there is any immediate danger to other communities in the wake of the Saturday's attack.

And we are very grateful to the Homewood Police Department which has been a tremendous partner throughout the years. They often check on our building to ensure its safety and security, and they are often in our parking lot, deterring loiterers and speeders alike.

Additionally, Shir Tikvah has taken several steps to ensure our community's safety, including installing shatter-proof film lining our windows and doors, security cameras throughout the building and around its perimeter, and keeping our doors locked at all times. Bob or a security guard is at our door during services and group gatherings, and we are continuing to monitor the safety of the Jewish community in the Chicago area through regular updates from JUF.

We pray for the healing and well-being of Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville, Texas, especially Rabbi Cytron-Walker and all the survivors of the attack. We pray for peace, respect, and understanding among people of all faiths. May the day come when Antisemitism is but a fading memory, and may we continue to work together, as one community, to support one another. Together, we will keep a Shir Tikvah, a song of hope, forever in our hearts and on our lips. Together, we will stay strong.



Roger has been proudly supporting the International Space Station (ISS) Program at NASA/Johnson Space Center in Houston, TX, since 2000. As Technical Integration Lead with contractor Barrios Technology, he leads an ISS Research Client Service+Satisfaction Team that interviews scientists and engineers about their space station utilization experience with NASA, and also monitors the ISS Helpline. As part of the ISS Research Communications Team, Roger manages myriad web pages for NASA.gov, namely the ISS Research & Technology website and Low-Earth Orbit Economy website. His everlasting passion and enthusiasm for all things space—especially the ISS and its benefits for humanity--allow him to engage, educate, and inspire people of all ages about NASA, its illustrious programs, accomplishments, and achievements during professional and voluntary outreach efforts at multiple venues. In 2017, Roger was awarded NASA's Exceptional Public Service Medal for his contributions to upholding the excellence of the ISS' on-orbit research endeavors.
