## Rabbi's Message



Over the past nine years, I have worked closely with our ritual committee. This committee, once two separate committees, became one shortly after our consolidation agreement went into effect in 2018. And it has had its work cut out for it as our community has explored what it means to be a dual-affiliated Reform and Conservative congregation. Worship is one area where our unique movemental perspectives are expressed, and this fact has made it more challenging to simply combine our traditions at all services and call it a day. I spoke with various colleagues who serve dual-affiliated congregations as well, and I found out that we are actually in the minority. Shir Tikvah is among the few URJ/USCJ affiliated congregations that holds what I would call fully Reform and fully Conservative services, rather than simply giving a nod to one or the other by way of a melody or an occasional reading or prayer. As such, holding a service that met the needs of congregants in both traditions was much more of a challenge. A few years ago, our ritual committee came up with a wonderful approach to the combined service: We begin in the Reform tradition, and we conclude in the Conservative one, transitioning from one tradition into the other at the Torah Reading. We use both Mishkan T'filah and Siddur Lev Shalem prayer books, and we find that in this model, we can stay true to the style of each service, and still be inclusive of both traditions. It is a model that has thus far worked very well for the Shir Tikvah community.

It is also a model we'd like to see more. We were already coming together at Kiddush before the pandemic began, and this way, our whole congregation can be together as one not just at the kiddush, but for the service as well. And so, we've come up with a new service schedule: Beginning on the first Shabbat in August, and following a four-week rotation – regardless of the number of months in a given Gregorian month - we will hold Shabbat morning services in the following order:

Week 1: Conservative Services

Week 2: Reform Services

Week 3: Conservative Services

Week 4: Combined Reform and Conservative Services

We have also elected to adjust the starting time of all these services to 9:45am in order to avoid confusion.

Friday evening services remain Reform, begin at 7:30pm, and on the weeks when we have a Conservative service on Shabbat morning, will also include the reading of the weekly Maftir portion from the Torah, as well as the Haftarah.

Occasional changes to this cycle will occur as in the case of our two upcoming B'nai Mitzvah: On Saturday morning, August 13th, services will begin at 10:00am and on Saturday morning, September 3rd, services will begin at 9:30am.

Last, please note that we also have new recurring Zoom links for Shabbat services. Please see the most recent "This Week at Shir Tikvah" emails for the most up to date links. Links provided prior to July 22, 2022, will no longer work.

Thank you so much to our ritual committee, led by Carole Fefferman and Janet Herbstman, for all of their hard work! We truly appreciate all of your efforts to enhance our communal experiences!

We look forward to continuing to grow as one community.

Hope to see you at services, in person and on Zoom!

## Presidents' Message

The dictionary defines transition as a process or period of change. Each of us goes through numerous changes in our lives: family, job, health. At Shir Tikvah, we also go through transition: a new school year, holidays and festivals, new members. We recently went through an important transition at Shir Tikvah: the transfer of leadership. Jerry Tenny recently completed a successful two year term as President and has passed leadership of Shir Tikvah to Sherry and me. Jerry has left Shir Tikvah in a strong position, and he continues his years of service by returning to the Treasurer's position. Many of you would say that the transition has been seamless. We are fortunate to have many people of wisdom and experience at Shir Tikvah: Rabbi Harari, our board and staff. Together, we will continue to move Shir Tikvah forward.

While things change at Shir Tikvah, there is one important constant, Rabbi Harari. We are excited to announce that Rabbi Harari has signed a new three year contract to continue as our spiritual leader. Rabbi Harari has been an integral part of our development and growth and helping us to manage through the Covid pandemic. It seems hard to believe, but Rabbi Harari is now into her tenth year at Shir Tikvah. Plans are in development to honor and celebrate Rabbi Harari during this temple year and we will keep the congregation informed.

Believe it or not, the High Holidays are less than two months away. Rabbi Harari will be leading the Conservative Services and Rabbi Zukrow will be leading the Reform Services. We also have a new Choir Director. Valerie Nicholson, who is in charge of music at Prairie State College, has already started working with our choir.

Security continues to be a concern at all synagogues, churches and public gatherings. In recent days we have seen incidents of shootings and killings in Highland Park, Flossmoor, South Holland and Greenwood, Indiana. The nightly news continues to lead with multiple shootings in Chicago. The violence is daily and has almost become commonplace and expected. At Shir Tikvah, we will continue to be vigilant in maintaining a safe environment for our members, staff and guests. We cannot become complacent or think that it will never happen here. You will continue to see the presence of armed security guards for services and events.

As part of our emphasis on security, we will continue the practice of sending High Holiday tickets to everyone who returns membership forms and pledge cards. These were mailed last month, and if you did not receive yours in the mail, please contact Kay at the office.

Each of us has to do our part to keep Shir Tikvah safe. In the past when we would send tickets out for the High Holidays, we would ask you to bring them to services and show them to the guards and ushers. Quite frankly, we didn't always enforce this, so people were allowed in without tickets. While we don't want to turn anyone away for the High Holidays, we cannot compromise on security. ALL PEOPLE ATTENDING HIGH HOLIDAY SERVICES FOR EITHER CONSERVATIVE OR REFORM MUST HAVE IN THEIR POSSESSION AND VISIBLE TO SECURITY A TICKET. It doesn't matter if you are a member in long standing or a new member, you must have a ticket. We will continue to reinforce this message as we get closer to the Holidays. We appreciate every one doing their part to keep us all safe.

We also want to make sure that should an incident occur at our facility or at a public event that you know how to react. The Homewood Police Department does Active Shooter Training in the community, and we have talked to them about a presentation at Shir Tikvah. This will take place on August 10th at 2 pm, and we encourage all to attend. 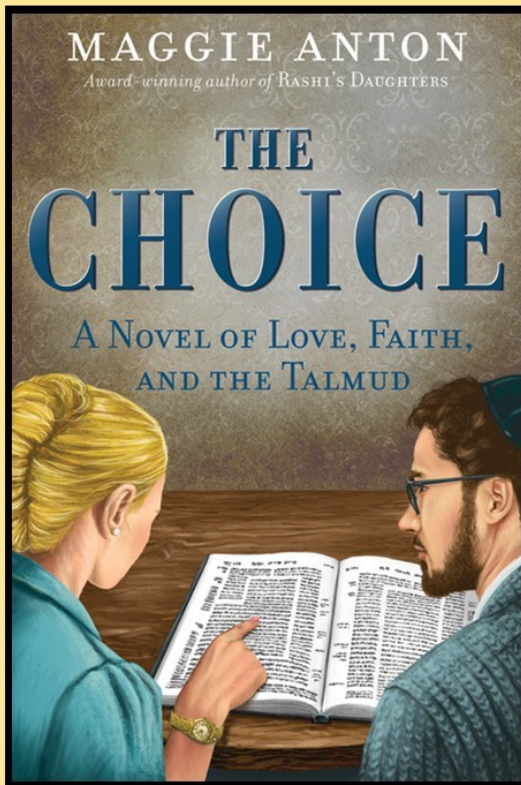
